Monday Sep 12th

First part commences with fresh breeze
Middle part light breeze finished boiling
Latter part moderate breeze lowered 3
boats checked off the fore hole with oil.

Tuesday Sep 13

First part commences with moderate
breeze. Middle part light breeze. Latter
part moderate breeze, employed in
stowing down oil lowered 3 boats

Wednesday Sep 14th

First part commences with moderate
breeze finished stowing down oil.
Middle part calm. Latter part calm
lowered 3 boats

Thursday Sep 15th

First part commences with light breeze
Middle part light breeze Latter part
calm hove up the anchor and lowered
3 boats. Cooper setting up shooks

Friday Sep 16th

First part commences with moderate
breeze. Middle part light breeze. Latter
part light breeze lowered 3 boats Cooper
setting up shooks

Saturday Sep 17th

First part commences with light breeze
Middle part light breeze. Latter part
moderate breeze lowered 2 boats

In Panama Bay

Sunday Sep 18th

First part commences with moderate
breeze the larboard boat struck a whale
over on the other shore hove up anchor and
went that way untill 10 1/2 PM the
wind died away and we anchored again.
Middle part light breeze Latter part rainy
hove up the anchor and took the whale alongside.
got ready and cut him in.

Monday Sep 19th

First part commences with light breeze
cut up the Whaler and started the works
Middle part light breeze Latter part
light breeze lowered 2 boats, the Waist
Boat struck a cow and calf

Tuesday Sep 20th

First part commences with light breeze
killed the whale and took him along side.
Middle part boiling Latter part moderate
breeze cut the whale

Wednesday Sep 21st

First part rainy. Middle part light breeze
boiling. Latter part light breeze lowered
2 boats

Thursday Sep 22nd

First part calm finished boiling
Middle part light breeze. Latter part rainy
lowered 3 boats

Friday Sep 23rd

First part commences with a calm Cooper
setting up shooks. Middle part light breeze
Latter part calm lowered 3 boats
