Remarks on board Cape Horn Pigeon

Friday Nov 4th
These 24 hours light breezes, cut and brought aboard 4 boat loads of wood and a small raft of water, sent down the sprails and bent the other two. Sprail got 2 bags of sand

Saturday Nov 5th
These 24 hours light winds with some rain bent the other Main sprail and bent the new Main sail at 7 A.M. hove up anchor and made sail and started to go out of the bay, at 4 P.M. calm anchored again.

Sunday Nov 6th
These 24 hours light airs and calms hove up anchor and made sail, gunned with the 24 Calib Canon, at dark anchored.

Monday Nov 7th
These 24 hours calm with light airs at 1 A.M. hove up anchor and made sail at 1 P.M. anchored, at 4¹/₂ hove up anchor again at 6 P.M. anchored again.

Tuesday Nov 8th
These 24 hours, calm with light breezes at daylight, hove up anchor and made sail, at 1 P.M. anchored. the wind was light and a strong head tide the Calib Canon anchored close to us

Wednesday Nov 9th
These 24 hours light winds and calms at 6 A.M. hove up anchor and made sail employed in various jobs at 2 P.M. anchored again.

Thursday Nov 10th
These 24 hours light winds and calms hove up anchor and made sail

Friday Nov 11th
First part commences with light airs and calms. Middle part light breeze steering S by E. Latter part rain.

Saturday Nov 12th
First part commences with light breeze from different directions steering S. Middle part light breeze. Latter part rain.

Sunday Nov 13th
First part commenced with light breeze from different directions. Middle part light breeze. Latter part moderate breeze.

Monday Nov 14th
First part commenced with light breeze from different directions. Middle part light breeze. Latter part light breeze employed in washing ship inside.

Tuesday Nov 15th
First part commenced with light breeze and calms, washing ship inside. Middle part rain. Latter part changeable finished washing ship

Wednesday Nov 16th
First part commenced with moderate breeze, breaking out provisions. Middle part fresh breeze furlled the light sails. Latter part strong breeze, bent the fore top mast key sail
