Saturday May 27th

First part commenced with fresh breeze and cloudy weather from NW heading off. Middle part fresh breeze. Latter part fresh breeze and cloudy saw the Is. of Matt.

Sunday May 28th

First part commenced with fresh breeze and cloudy weather gammed with the Attleboro. Middle part fresh breeze. Latter part light breeze and cloudy heading off shore.

Monday May 29th

First part commenced with moderate breeze and cloudy weather. Middle part moderate breeze. Latter part moderate breeze and cloudy gammed with the Attleboro.

Tuesday May 30th

First part commenced with fresh breeze and partly clear weather. Middle part moderate breeze. Latter part fresh breeze saw another Whaler.

Wednesday May 31st

First part commenced with fresh breeze and clear weather, saw blackish. Middle part fresh breeze. Latter part fresh breeze and clear.

Thursday June 1st

First part commenced with fresh breeze and clear weather. Middle part fresh breeze. Latter part fresh breeze and cloudy heading in shore.

First part fresh breeze and cloudy weather heading in shore. Middle part moderate breeze. Latter part moderate breeze and cloudy repaired the Miffen topmast stay sail.

Saturday June 3rd

First part commenced with moderate breeze and cloudy weather saw the Is. of Matt. repaired the Left topsail. Middle part strong breeze. repaid the top sails. Latter part strong breeze and cloudy.

Sunday June 4th

First part commenced with strong breeze and cloudy weather. Middle part fresh breeze. Latter part moderate breeze and cloudy heading in shore.

Monday June 5th

First part commenced with fresh breeze and partly foggy weather. Middle part moderate breeze. Latter part moderate breeze.

Tuesday June 6th

First part commenced with moderate breeze and cloudy weather saw the land. Middle part moderate breeze. Latter part moderate breeze. Anchored at Lumbay.

Wednesday June 7th

First part commenced with moderate breeze and clear weather. unbent the top sails and bent the Humpback topsail.
