Remarks on board Cape Horn Pigeon
Thursday June 5th

First part commenced with moderate breeze and pleasant weather got a raft of water to the mouth of the river and it grounded anchored it until the next day

Friday June 6th

These 24 hours moderate breezes and pleasant weather got off the raft of water and stowed it below

Saturday June 7th

First part commenced with moderate weather Starboard Watch went ashore on liberty. Middle part light breeze. Latter part moderate breeze

Sunday June 8th

These 24 hours moderate breezes and pleasant weather Starboard Watch ashore on liberty

Monday June 9th

These 24 hours moderate breezes and fine weather, cleaned the heads and repaired the spanker, received 20 bunches of plantains from shore Starboard Watch ashore on liberty.

Tuesday June 10th

These 24 hours moderate breezes and clear weather. Starboard Watch came on board and the Starboard Watch went ashore on liberty. shipped a man by the name of Russell for a boat header

Wednesday June 11th

These 24 hours moderate breezes and pleasant weather, Starboard Watch ashore on liberty

Thursday June 12th

These 24 hours moderate breezes and fine weather Starboard Watch ashore on liberty, got some wood from shore the Linda Stewart came to anchor.

Friday June 13th

These 24 hours fresh breezes and pleasant weather, the Starboard Watch came on board

Saturday June 14th

These 24 hours moderate breezes and pleasant weather.

Sunday June 15th

These 24 hours moderate breezes and pleasant weather, the Albatross came to anchor.

Monday June 16th

These 24 hours moderate breezes and clear weather, the Emma H. Harriman of Boston came to anchor. put the Starboard Watch on the Starboard crane, and the Waist boat on the Starboard crane

Tuesday June 17th

First part commenced with moderate breeze and clear weather. Middle part light breeze. Latter part moderate breeze and cloudy. at daylight hove up anchor and made sail
