breeze to the
East

Tuesday November 27 First part of these day began with strong North wind and cloudy weather, vessel under fore sail main try sail and jib, steering ESE on Port tack, three days we were near fore peak halibut, vessel shipping much water on deck, pump carefully attended to

Lat 32° 47' Long 46° 01' 10"

Wednesday 28 November, First part of these day fresh breeze from North East, and squally with rain, vessel under main try sail fore sail and head sails, heading ESE on Port tack crew making senet, pump attended to

Lat 32° 30' Long 44° 04'

Thursday November 29 First part of these day light breeze from the North East, and squally, vessel under all sails set, latter part calm we took main sail set main try sail, pump attended to

Lat 32° 20' Long 42° 03'

Friday November 30 First part of these day light breeze from the South West and clear weather, vessel under all set, on Starboard tack, heading SE by E, pump attended to

Lat 32° 20' Long 40° 43'

Saturday, December 1 First part of these day strong breeze from the Southeast with squally, vessel under all sails set, at 4 P.M. we took main sails set main try sails vessel shipping much water on deck pump attended to

Lat 32° 20' Long 38° 19'

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Sunday December 2 First part of these day strong breeze from the Southeast with squally all day, vessel under try sail fore sail, and fore stay sails standing to the windward on Starboard tack, at 4 P.M. the wind hauled up more to the Eastward, we were round on Port tack, pump attended to

Lat 32° 40' Long 37° 00'

Monday December 3 First part of these day fresh breeze from the Southeast with rain and squally and rough sea, vessel under short sails, standing on wind on Starboard tack, the fore stay careenway, we splashed and set up again, we set up the fore and main regens at 5 P.M. the wind hauled up more to the Eastward, we were round on Port tack, pump attended to

Lat 31° 55' Long 37° 12'

Tuesday December 4 First part of these day strong wind from the Southeast with squally and rain, vessel under shorting sails standing to the windward on Port tack, vessel shipping much water on deck, pump carefully attended to

Lat 31° 00' Long 37° 05'

Wednesday December 5 First part of these day strong breeze from the Southeast and squally with rain, vessel under main try sail fore sail and jib, at 4 P.M. were ship on Starboard tack, heading East, pump attended to

Lat 30° 11' Long 36° 54'
