Monday April 8 at Dominica with fine light wind from the trade and clear weather we start to making water, we take one rough on board -

Tuesday April 9 at Dominica with strong breeze from the trade and rain all forenoon we take some water on board Capt - trade some beef with James saw hand of this day

Wednesday April 10 at Dominica with fresh breeze from the trade and clear weather this day we take two pigs of water on board saw hand of this day

Thursday April 11 at Dominica with fine weather this day we shopped two cask of oil board schooner "Fredrick Rossmore" and we take two emket from Avery, to stow down and we took some water to fill them

Friday April 12 at Dominica with heavy rain all fore noon this day we take 5 barrels of fresh potatoes from Capt Avery and we take 1584 pounds of Lams from shore and we send to made new belt for fore pick, halibut block, and we take 2 cads of Woods, and we stow of the hole, ready to sea.

Saturday April 13 at 2 clock P.M. we sail from Dominica to St Eustatius one of the crew desert from the ship, name Trophilo Allen saw hand of this day -

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Sunday April 14 come to anchor at St Eustatius at 2 P.M. with fine breeze and smooth sea on saw hand of this day

Monday April 15 at St Eustatius with fine weather we set up the rigging, and we take 12 barrels of sweet potatoes on board and few cades of gum for the crew saw hand of this day we point, Jack Murre for Steward

Tuesday April 16 Sail from St Eustatius for cruise vessel under all sails set steering NW by N with fresh breeze from the trade we found one man stow away him selves board ship, saw hand of this day

Wednesday April 17 First part of this day light breeze from the NE and clear weather vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack steering NW by N crew making sunset pump attended to.

Thursday April 18 First part of this day very light wind from the South East and clear weather, vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack running off NW by N pump attended to.

Friday April 19 First part of this day very light wind from the Southeast and smooth sea, vessel under all sails set running off NW by N saw a school of grampas, and steamer - bound to South East, crew making sunset pump attended to.
