 Lat 37.08 Long 74.00

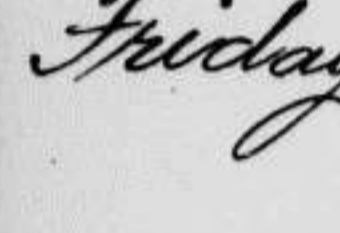
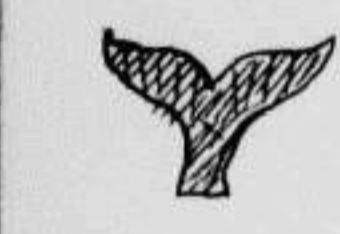
Wednesday May 1 First part of this day fresh breeze from the Northeast with thick fog vessel under shorting sails standing to the Windward, on Starboard tack, one Whalers in sight in morning boiling pumps attended to
 Lat 37.14 Long 73.50

Thursday May 2 First part of this day fresh breeze from the NE with thick fog and rain all day vessel under short sails standing to the Windward on Port tack, at noon we were ship to the Northward Whaling Schooner in sight at 11 AM. at 6 PM we took up and lay on Starboard tack pumps attended to

Friday May 3 First part of this day strong breeze from the Northeast and cloudy weather, vessel under fore sail main try sail and head sail standing to the Northward, at 4 PM we lowered the Starboard Boat Capt went aboard of Whaling Schooner "E B Conwell", and returned aboard at 6 PM. we took fore sail set fore try sail pumps attended to
 Lat 37.20 Long 73.52

Saturday May 4 First part of this day very strong breeze from the Southeast with rough sea, on and heavy rain squall, vessel under two try sail and fore stay sail, standing to the Windward, on Port tack, two Whalers in sight pumps attended to
 Lat 37.35 Long 73.40

Sunday May 5 First part of this day strong breeze from the Northeast with rough sea vessel under fore sail main try sail and jib standing to the windward on Starboard tack, at 9 AM we saw a school of Small Whales going to South West, we lowered two Boats, but the Whales going quick they went to the Stream, the Boats come aboard we hoist up and were ship to the North West, "Elena Sweet" in sight in after noon we raised a one other school of Small Whales we lowered three Boats and "Sweet" lowered two, the Whales going to the Windward we can't not get near the Boats return on Board and hoist up standing to the North West - the jaw of fore gas brook the Capt put new one steel he working all fore noon pumps attended to at sund down we shorting sail
 Lat 37.37 Long 73.00

Monday May 6 First part of this day very strong breeze from the Southeast and rough sea on vessel under shorting sails standing to the windward, on Port tack "Elena Sweet" in sight at 4 PM we were aboard on Starboard tack pumps attended to
 Lat 37.36 N Long 72.36 W

Tuesday May 7 First part of this day very strong breeze from the South East and rough sea with heavy rain squall, vessel under two try sails and fore stay sail, standing to the windward - latter part dead calm with thick fog at 2 PM we raised a school of small whales near to the ship, we lowered two Boats, the Whales was going to the South West the fog was so thick the Boats returned on Board, we hoist up, and we keep blow the fog horn every five minutes, great swell from the North West pumps attended to
