Friday May 31 First part of this day strong breeze from the North East with rough sea on Schooner under shorting sails standing to the windward on Starboard tack. crew employed repairing the ribs and we made new cover for the works - saw a Steamer, bound to North East in afternoon moderate wind we set fore stay sail, Brokaw's Tack, and melacres, pump attended to.

Lat 38° 8' Long 71° 03'

Saturday June 1 First part of this day fresh breeze from the East and cloudy weather in morning we raised a school of small Whales going to the windward quick we did not lower the Boats at 2 o'clock in afternoon we raise another school we lower two Boats but the Whales going to the windward, began to buck up strong with rough sea on we can't get near the Boats returned on board we hoist up and we took in fore sails and set melacres, pump attended to.

Lat 38° 10' Long 71° 01'

Sunday June 2 First part of this day, blowing ^{SE gale Windy} hard with heavy sea, and squall. Schooner under two put try sails standing to the windward on Starboard tack. we let down the hatch cover, vessel shipped much water on deck, later part moderate wind, with heavy rain and great swell from the South and took fog. pump attended to.

Lat 38° 55' Long 71° 05'

Present: Hard bread and melacres

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Monday June 3 First part of this day very strong breeze from the North West with rough sea on Schooner under shorting sails lying to on Starboard tack, saw a three mast schooner bound to the North East, pump attended to. No observation sun or stars.

Tuesday June 4 First part of this day very strong breeze from the West with rain and rough sea on Schooner under two try sails lying to on Starboard tack at 6 P.M. moderate wind we set fore stay sail vessel shipped much water on deck pump attended to.

Lat 38° 30' Long 71° 31'

Wednesday June 5 First part of this day strong breeze from the South East with squall at 1 o'clock we raised a school of small Whales going to the windward we lower two Boats but we can't get near to them the Boats returned on board and we hoist up and we standing to the North pump attended to.

Lat 38° 05' Long 70° 40'

Thursday June 6 First part of this day fresh breeze from the South West and rain with cloudy weather vessel under two try sails and lying to the windward on Starboard tack at noon we raised a school of small Whales to the windward of was going quick we did not lower the Boats later part very light wind with heavy swell from the North West. pump attended to.

Lat 38° 03' Long 70° 18'
