Saturday June 8 First part of this day strong South West Wind with heavy rain all day vessel under shorting sails sailing on Port tack later part high wind with great swell from the West and rain - Saw a steamer bound to the Northeast pump attended to - No observation this day

Sunday June 9 First part of this light breeze from the North West and smooth sea, vessel under shorting sails sailing on Port tack, later part strong breeze with rough sea on, we put some oil down and broscawt flour, start new cask, pump attended to -

Monday June 10 First part of this day very strong breeze from the North West and rough sea on vessel under two try sails and sit standing to the windward on Starboard tack this day we finished stave downer de oils and stave off the hole and washed the vessel in sight pump attended to -

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Tuesday June 11 First part of this day very light breeze from the North East and clear weather vessel under all sails sit standing to the windward on Starboard tack. Saw a Grampus, at sundown we shorting sails pump attended to

Wednesday June 12 First part of this day very strong breeze from the North East with rough sea on vessel under two try sails and one stay sails standing to the windward on Starboard tack. Saw a Whaling Bark to the leeward of us, supposed to be "Bertha" crew make some pump attended to

P.M. the vessel the whale ran to the stream the boats went all must out sight. We send to boats to halping tow the whale along side we taking at 5. in the morning pump attended to
