Saturday June 15 First part of this day very light wind from the North West with rain vessel under shorting sails, at 5:46 we start fire, at 11:46 we raised a school of small whales the weather got squally we did not see him any more, at 6:30 P.M. we sighted another school of small whales but we did not lower the boat because it was too late, saw a steamer bound to the Eastward pump attended to

Sunday June 16 First part of this day very light breeze from the North West in morning we set main sails on Starboard tack, standing to the windward, boiling later part dead calm we took in main sails, at 9 clock P.M. we finished boiling - pump attended to

Monday June 17 First part of this day dead calm vessel under two try sails, this day we finished stow down and stow up of the hole and washed the vessel in side saw a lot of Grampas, and Steamers bound to East, pump attended to

Tuesday June 18 First part of this day fresh breeze from the South East, and cloudy weather vessel under two try sails and fore standing to the windward on Port tack, at sun down we now ship to the Eastward - pump attended to

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Wednesday June 19 First part of this day light breeze from the South West and fog vessel under all sails set cruising saw a steamer bound to the Eastward saw a lot of Grampas and Porpoises at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to

Thursday June 20 First part of this day fresh breeze from the South West and clear weather vessel under main try sails fore sails and head sails standing to the windward this day we broaut hard bread and vinegar crew making saxon at sun set we took in fore sails set fore try sails pump attended to

Friday June 21 First part of this day light breeze from the South West with fog vessel under shorting sails on Starboard tack crew making saxon this day we were protch local pump attended to

Latt 38.13 Long 70.24

Saturday June 22 First part of this day dead calm vessel under two try sails and fore later part took fog crew making saxon we brochaunt saxon and Day saw a steamer bound to the West pump attended to

Sunday June 23 First part of this day very light wind from the South East and clear weather vessel under all sails set cruising saw lot of porpoises, at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to
