Tuesday July 16 First part of this day light breeze from the North East and clear weather vessel under all sails, setting up to the windward. Saw a merchant bark going to the North East at sun set we took in main sails and flying jib pump attended to.

Wednesday July 17 First part of this day gentle breeze from the North East and clear weather vessel under all sails, set, tacking to the windward. Crew making snits at sun set we took in main sails and flying jib, and stand on Starboard tack. pump attended to.

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Thursday July 18 First part of this day fresh breeze from the North East and clear weather at day light we set main sails and flying jib on Port tack, tacking to the windward at sun set we wore ship on Starboard tack and we took in main sails and flying jib pump attended to.

Friday July 19 First part of this day very light wind from the North East and clear weather vessel under all sails set, standing to the Northward on Starboard tack, this day we caught lots of fish at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to.

Saturday July 20 First part of this day light breeze from the South West with clear weather in morning we made all sails and punning off star E & S at sun set we took in main sails and flying jib pump attended to.

Sunday July 21 First part of this day fresh breeze from the South West with squally vessel under shorting sails standing to the windward on Port tack. Saw a Steamer bound to the South West pump attended to.
