Wednesday December 11 First part of this day fresh breeze from the Southeast with clear weather, vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack, stern East crew making steam at sun set we took up main sail set main try sails pump attended to.

Lat 21.24 S Long 6.39 E

Thursday December 12 First part of this day very light wind with calm all day vessel under shorting sail, crew making steam saw a steamer bound to South pump attended to.

Lat 20.53 S Long 7.35 E

Friday December 13 First part of this day light breeze from the South East with clear weather vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack heading E by N saw a porpoise, crew making steam at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to.

Lat 20.30 S Long 8.44 E

Saturday December 14 First part of this day fresh breeze from the S.E. with cloudy weather, vessel under main try sails fore sails and head sails standing on windward and on Starboard tack, at sun set we took up fore sails and set fore try sails and we were round on Port tack - pump attended to.

Lat 19.35 S Long 11.20 E

Sunday December 15 First part of this day light breeze from the S.E. with smooth sea on at day light we made all sails on Starboard tack stern East at noon we sight the Land at 3.20 we were ship on Port tack, we rate the Chronometer. Was 100 miles out to the Westward, gave a tramp back going to the windward and lots of porpoise, at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to.

Lat 19.04 S Long 12.30 E

Monday December 16 First part of this day very strong breeze from the S.E. with foggy weather vessel under two try sails and fore stay sails standing on windward on Port tack, Broke out Flour and mellece water, etc. pump attended to.

Lat 19.00 S Long 11.17 E

Tuesday December 17 First part of this day very strong wind from the South East with rough sea on vessel under two try sails and fore stay sails standing on windward on Port tack, crew employed on repair the fore sails pump attended to.

Lat 18.44 S Long 11.20 E

Wednesday December 18 First part of this day strong breeze from the South East, with rough sea on. Vessel under two try sails and fore stay sails on Starboard tack standing on windward, at sun set we were round on Port tack pump attended to.
