No observation this day sun obscure

Wednesday March 18 First part of this fresh breezes from the SE with clear weather vessel under all sails set on Port tack running off steer W West, saw a Merchant vessel bound to NE crew making sence pump attended to

Lat 2° 18 S Long 28° 51

Thursday March 19 First part of this day light breezes from the SE with cloudy weather vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack running off steer WNW - saw a steamer bound to SE West later part squally with rain we took in main sails pump attended to

Lat 1° 40 S Long 30° 10 W

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Friday March 20 First part of this day fresh breezes from the SE with clear weather, vessel under all sails set on Port tack running off W West, saw merchant bark bound to the NE and a steamers bound to the South West - pump attended to

Lat 1° 10 S Long 30° 50 W

Saturday March 21 First part of this day light breezes from the SE with clear weather, at noon we came to Bark "Morning Star" the Capt. went aboard of her, and returned aboard at 6: P M. we take one barrel beer from her, she bound to Barbados, from St Helena 15 days out with 1000 barrels silk - later part squally with rain we shorting sails pump attended to
No observation this day sun obscure

Sunday March 22 First part of this day light breezes with clear weather, at day light we made all sails on Starboard tack steer WNW "Morning Star" in sight - saw a steamer bound to NE, pump attended to
