Friday May 22 First part of this day very light breeze from the SE with cloudy weather. Vessel under all sails set on Port tack heading SSW at 6: clock P.M. we were ship on Starboard tack at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to.

Saturday May 23 First part of this day very light breeze from the SE with foggy and rain in morning. Vessel under all sails set on Port tack heading SSW. Saw a steamer bound to Eastward at sun set we shorting sails, pump attended to.
Lat 38° 08' N Long 71° 38' W

Sunday May 24 First part of this day dead calm, all day Vessel under no sails set, saw a three mast Schooner to the South of us, the weather was foggy and clear up at sun set, pump attended to.
Lat 37° 59' N Long 72° 06' W

Monday May 25 First part of this day dead calm with thick fog, Vessel under two topsails several steamers may be blow whistled -- we keep bright lookout crew making sentry pump attended to.
no observation this day sun obscured

Tuesday May 26 First part of this day dead calm with thick fog. Vessel under no sails set, at noon clear up with light breeze from the South East we made all sails on Starboard tack heading SSE at 4:30 P.M. we raised a school of small whales we lower three Boats W.B. struck a small whale, the line part he force his Whales, the rest went to the Windward at sun set Boats returned on Board, we shorting sails

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Wednesday May 27 First part of this day good breeze from the SE with clear weather at day light we made the sails standing to South on Starboard tack at 6:30 P.M. we raised a school of small whales we lower three Boats we caught 4. L.B. 1. S.B. 2 W.B. 1. We stake this whales along side at 11: A.M. and we put gear up and we get dinner, we start to cut in whale at 4:30 we finished cut in whale and we took gear down and we clear up the hulls at 8: P.M. we start fire in shorting sails pump attended to.
Lat 38° 06' N Long 71° 27' W

Thursday May 28 First part of this day very light breeze from the SE with thick fog. Vessel under two topsails and flier on Starboard tack, boiling at noon the weather clear up we set main sails, at 3: P.M. we raised a school of small Whales, going quick to SE we lower two Boats, but can't get near the Whales they went out sight the Boats returned on board, we hoist up and we shorting sails pump attended to.
Lat 38° 04' N Long 71° 24' W

Friday May 29 First part of this day fresh breeze from the SE with thick fog in morning at noon weather clear up we set main sails and fore sails on Port tack at 7: A.M. we finished boiling at 3: P.M. we sighted the Whales to the South of us, one Bark, two Schooners one of them was boiling. We stow down the coils at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to.
