Sunday May 31 First part of this day very light breeze from the South East with foggy vessel under main trysails fore sails and head sails on Starboard tack heading S.E. at 9: A.M. we raised a school of small Whales, we lower three Boats caught 4 - S.B.-2 - S.B.-1 - W.B.-1 - We take this Whales along side at 12: clock, and we get dinner, and we put gears up, we commence cut in, at 6: P.M. we finished, and we took gears down and we get supper and we set watch, one watch clear up the heads and start fire we shorting sails pump attended to.

Monday June 1 First part of this day very light breeze from the South West with clear weather in morning vessel under shorting sails, bailing at noon dead calm with thick fog saw a Grampus at 6: P.M. wind hold to the North West, very light the weather clear up saw a Steamer, bound to Eastward we pump out some fresh water to have cask ready for oil, at 11: P.M. we finished bailing pump attended to.

Tuesday June 2 First part of this day fresh breeze from the West with foggy weather vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack heading S.W. by W. at 1: P.M. we raised a school of small Whales we lower three Boats, we catch 2 small Whales, S.B.-1 - S.B.-1 - W.B. got fast harpoon drove off. we take this Whales along side at 11: A.M. and we put gears up we commence to cut in at 4: we finished cut in and we took gears down and we clear up the head. Capt went forward, Schroner, Camea, and returned forward before supper and we shorting sails pump attended to.

No observation this day

Wednesday June 3 First part of this day light breeze from the West with clear weather vessel under two trysails and fore sailing on Port tack, "Camea" E. Supet "Bertha" all in sight at 11:30 A.M. we raised a school of small Whales we lower two Boats we catch 2 S.B.-1 - S.B.-1 - We take this Whales along side at 6: P.M. and we drove up the Whales pump - attended to. Lat 27.26 N Long 71.22 W

Thursday June 4 First part of this day dead calm vessel under two trysails and fore staysails, at day light we commence cut in Whales, at 11:30 A.M. we finished cut in and we took gears down and we clear up the head and we put some oils down we start fire pump attended to. At noon we raised a school of small Whales, we lower 3 Boats chase all afternoon the S Boat went to the Whales the Boat later dart the Iron but did not get fast. No observation this day Sun oblique
