 Lat 38.18 Long 71.03

Sunday June 7 First part of this day very light breeze from the NE with clear weather at day light we made all sails on Port tack saw a porpoise crew making senets, at sun set we shorting sails - pump attended to  
 Lat 37.51 Long 71.14

Monday June 8 First part of this day light SE breeze with clear weather in morning we made all sails on Port tack standing to the South East at 1:30 P.M. we raised a school of small whales we lower 3 Boats we catch 2 small Whales L B-1 = S B-2 we take this Whales along side at 5: P.M. and we shorting sails and we put gear up ready to cut in next morning - Lat 37.48 Long 70.54

Wednesday June 10 First part of this day light breeze from the South East with clear weather at day light we made all sails on Port tack standing to South West at 6: P.M. we raised a school of small Whales we lower three Boats we catch 2 small Whales L B-1 = S B-1. the 2 Boats get stow by Whales we take this Whales along side at 8: P.M. and we shorting sails pump attended to  
 Lat 37.58 N Long 71.30

Thursday June 11 First part of this day very light breeze from the South West with rain and foggy at 6: A.M. the rain stop we put gear down and we commence to cut in Whales at 9: A.M. we raised a school of small Whales close to the vessel we lower two Boats and catch 2 S B-1 = W B-2 = we take this Whales along side at 3: P.M. and start cut in at sun down we cut 4, live one to next morning, and weather start freezer up with heavy rain and rough sea on, pump attended to  
 No observation sun obscure

Friday June 12 First part of this day light wind with heavy swell from East, in morning we commence cut in Whales at 8:30 A.M. we finished cut in Whales and we took gear down and we clear up the heads and we start fire pump attended to  
 Lat 37.50 N Long 70.56
