 Thursday June 18 First part of this day very strong breeze from the NE with clear weather, vessel under two try sails and fore stay sails, on starboard tack, standing on windward, vessel shipped much water on deck, pump attended to

Friday June 19 First part of this day fresh breeze from the NE with clear weather at day light we set fore sails and had sails on starboard tack, steered NW by W saw a steamer bound to Eastward crew making net, at sun set we took in fore sails set fore try sails, saw a porpoise pump attended to

Saturday June 20 First part of this day very light breeze from the South West with fog, vessel under all sails set on Port tack, heading NW by W saw a steamer bound to East and saw a lot of porpoises at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to
