Wednesday July 15 First part of this day light breeze from the West with foggy weather. Weel under shorting sails standing on Windward on Port tack saw a Lark - pump attended to.

Weel under two try sails and jib, on Starboard tack, we unhook the foresails to repair at 3:00 PM we finished repair the fore sails and we hauled and we set it at 6:00 PM we raised a crew of small whales we lower 3 boats we catch 1:00 PM we take what along side

Saturday July 18 First part of this day light breeze from the West with foggy weather. Weel under stave try sails and jib, - standing on windward on Starboard tack, this day we stave down the sails and stave off the hole saw a porpoise pump attended to.

Sunday July 19 First of this day strong breeze from the SE with foggy weather. Weel under two try sails and jib at noon we were ship on Port tack, saw a three mast schooner bound to North pump attended to.

Monday July 20 First of this day strong breeze from the SE with clear weather. Weel under shorting sails, on Port tack standing on Windward, saw a steamer bound to NE. crew making senete pump attended to.
