

Wednesday May 5 First part of this day fresh breezes from the S West with clear weather. Vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack heading S S E. Crew employed rigging the Boat at 3: P.M. we wore ship on Port tack. Saw a few back pump attended to.

Thursday May 6 First part of this day fresh breezes from the South West with clear weather. Vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack heading S S E at 6: P.M. we wore ship on Port tack pump attended to.

Friday May 7 First part of this day light breezes from the S West with foggy. Vessel under all sails set on Port tack at 7: A.M. we wore ship on Starboard tack at 8:30 we raised a school of small Whales we lower three Boats we got three S B = 1 S B = 2 = W Boat struck a small whale the line got foul on one of the men he cut his line and loosed his whale the man got hurt by his steel of duty at 4: P.M. we take whale along side and we shorting sails and put gear up ready to cut in water morning pump attended to.

Saturday May 8 First part of this day dead calm with foggy weather at day light we commence cut in whale at noon we finished cut in and took gear down and clear up the head at 6: P.M. we divided up the watch and started fire pump attended to.

Sunday May 9 First part of this day light breezes from the S West with clear weather. Vessel under shorting sails on Port tack sailing. Saw a few back and steamed round to West one man off duty sick pump attended to.

Monday May 10 First part of this day light wind from the South West with cloudy weather. Vessel under shorting sails at 7: A.M. we finished boiling and we stowed off down and clear up the deck. Saw a schooner to the Westward pump attended to.

Tuesday May 11 First part of this day strong breezes from the S West with clear weather. Vessel under shorting sails running on Starboard tack. Saw a few back at sun down we took in fore sails set fore trysails one man off duty sick pump attended to.

Wednesday May 12 First part of this day strong breezes from the NE with cloudy weather and rough sea on vessel under two trysails and fore staysails on Starboard tack. Standing on windward "Elena Swift" in sight at sun set moderate wind pump attended to.

Thursday May 13 First part of this day fresh breezes from the South West with clear weather at day light we made sails and raised a school of small Whales we lower three Boats we catch a small whale S B = at 9: A.M. we take this whale along side and we put gear up and we commence to cut in at 11: A.M. we commenced cut in at 3: P.M. we raised another school of small Whales we lower three Boats we got none. Pump attended to = Elena Swift in sight all day.
