Thursday July 22 First part of this day fresh breezes from the SE with clear weather vessel under all shorting sails on Port tack at 4:30 PM we finished boiling, pump attended to.

Friday July 23 First part of this day fresh SE Wind with rough sea in this day we stave down the oils and wash the vessel in sight, Manuel Farter off duty sick at 2: PM more moderate wind we set fore sail and flying jib wore ship on Starboard tack at sun set we took in fore sails set fore try sails pump attended to.

Saturday July 24 First part of this day light breezes from the SE with clear weather at daylight we made all sails on Port tack heading S. Saw a Whaling Bark to the windward with Boats down chasing Whales, at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to.

 Sunday July 25 First part of this day light breezes from the SE with clear weather at day light we made all sails on Starboard tack at noon we sighted Whaling Schooner with three Boats down chasing Whales she struck Young Bull, we did not lower the Boats, to far, at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to.

Monday July 26 First part of this day very light breezes from the SE with squally vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack heading East at 11:30 we sighted a whaling Schooner with Boats down to the leeward we did not lower the Boats to far far we, Whaling Bark in sight, at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to.

Lat 34:14 Long 48:55 W.

Tuesday July 27 First part of this day light SE breezes with squall and rain vessel under all sails set on Port tack heading SW. Saw a Grampus and porpoises crew making single at sun down we shorting sails pump attended to.

Lat 34:32 Long 48:22

Wednesday July 28 First part of this day light breezes from the SE with clear weather vessel under all sails set on Port tack - saw lots of Grampus, and Steamer bound to SW at sun set we shorting sails - pump attended to.
