Saturday August 28 First part of the day very light wind with calm, vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack in morning we sighted the Islands of Flores, and saw a Grampas pumps attended to.

Lat 38:40 Long 30:45

Sunday August 29 First part of this day light breeze from the NE with clear weather vessel under all sails set on Port tack Steered E by E Flores in sight in morning saw a Grampas pumps attended to.

Lat 38:30 Long 30:05

Monday August 30 First part of this day light breeze from the SE with clear weather, vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack heading E by S at day light we sighted the Taya, and Pico - about 45 miles off. Saw a merchant vessel bound to Eastward crew wash the vessel in side at sun set dead calm.

Tuesday August 31 First part of this day fresh breeze from the SE with clear weather vessel under all sails set steered E by S 1/2 S to St Michaels saw a Bark to the leeward, bound to Eastward at 11:30 P.M. we sighted St Michaels pumps attended to.

Lat 37:40 Long 28:21 West

Wednesday Sept 1 First part of this day very light wind with calm all day vessel under all sails set, wait for more wind to get in St Michaels Bark to the leeward suppose to be whales pumps attended to. No observation.

Thursday Sept 2 First part of this day very light wind from the East with clear weather vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack heading E by E. Saw a Whaling Bark to the leeward of us pumps attended to.

Friday Sept 3 First part of this day dead calm with clear weather vessel under all sail set St Michaels in sight about 25 miles off, Whaling Bark, in sight pumps attended to. No observation.

Saturday Sept 4 First part of this day light breeze from the SE with clear weather vessel under all sails set on tacking to windward, at 3 P.M. we take Long Boat out side of Brakwater and we come in and more the vessel the pilot, come on Board. Saw herd of this day. No watch went on shore.
