~~Friday~~ September 30 St St Michael, with fine weather we taken water on board, 4 men returned from board from seal and 3 men runaway - was Oscar A. Carlson, Frank P. Perry, John M. Lopez

~~Saturday~~ Oct 1 at St Michael with fresh breeze and rain, we finished taking water, we take 5 barrels beef from "F. Pioneer" and 2 from John P. Monte we discharge, Manuel Futer, Manuel Gomes, Henry O'Brien, J. E. Smith, R. E. Grey, Herman Caraday, we wash the vessel in side

~~Sunday~~ October 2 this day began with very light wind from the SW, and clear weather we paint the vessel in side

Sunday

~~Monday~~ October 3 this day began with very light wind from SE and rain we take potatoes on board

Monday

~~Tuesday~~ October 4 this day began with good weather we finished paint the vessel in side

~~Wednesday~~ October 5 this day began with fine weather and light wind from SE we take some potatoes and recruits for sea, and we bend new foresails
