

Saturday October 9 - We sails from St. Michael's Bay Whaling passage, at 6 P.M. the Polands bears W. We take departure for Capricorn Islands, steer S.E. by S. Water at 7: Clock P.M. we set watch the Starboard side first watch on deck, pump attended to.

Sunday October 10 this day began with moderate wind from the S.West with clear weather at noon we was 100 miles from St. Michael's. We found four man, stone way them selves, names, João S. S. Albuquerque Silva, Alcanore S. S. Albuquerque Silva, Manoel M. Pereira. José Joaquim Cruvello. Vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack steer South crew employed straight up the Boats, no observation sun obscure.

Monday October 11 this day began with light breeze from the S.E. with rain all day crew wash the vessel in side saw a Barr suppose to be 'Pray pound' pump attended to. - No observation sun obscure.

Tuesday October 12 this day began with fresh breezes from S.E. with clear weather Vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack steer S.S.W. at noon breeze up strong with rain we took in main sails, set main topsails. Pump attended to, No observation.

Wednesday October 13 this day began with fresh breezes from the East with foggy weather Vessel under topsails courses and set on Starboard tack Steer S.S.W. at 8: A.M. commence to rain and squally all day. Pump attended to. No observation.

Thursday October 14 this day began with fresh breezes from the N.E. with clear weather Vessel under all sails set on Port tack - run off S.S.W. pump attended to. Lat 27:18 N. Long 25:26 W.

Friday October 15 this day began with fresh breezes from trades and rough sea on Vessel under all sails set on Port tack steering off S.S.W. pump attended to, No observation sun obscure.

Saturday October 16 this day began with fresh breezes from the trades and clear weather Vessel under all sails set on Port tack - running off S.S.W. Saw a full rigged ship bound to South, pump attended to. Lat 22:07 N. Long 25:06 W.

Sunday October 17 this day began with fresh breezes from the N.E. with clear weather Vessel under all sails, set on Port tack steer S by W. pump attended to. Lat 20:24 N. Long 25:10 W.

Monday October 18 this day began with moderate wind from the trade and clear weather Vessel under all sails set on Port tack steer S by W. at 9: A.M. we sighted the St. Anthony - at 7: P.M. we pass between St. Vincente and St. Anthony pump attended to the stern daves broke on Starboard side the top leftmast stuck on Boat.

Tuesday October 19 this day began with fresh breezes from the trades and foggy - at 2: P.M. we come to anchor at Brava, on 15 fathom water, some of the crew went shore to see their family.
