Tuesday May 17 This day light breeze from the SE with clear weather, vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack heading ENE at 1: clock we raised a 5 bulls Whales. We lower three Boats, we caught one of them L.B. we take this whale along side at 3:30 P.M. and we put gears up ready to cutting next morning. at 6 clock P.M. the second mate Antonio Andrade got bad cut on his neck, by bomb lance, he went pull the bomb lance out of gun the lance burst, a piece of brass struck him on the neck, Capt attended him. We shorting sails, pump attended to.

Lat 23° 16 Long 62° 01 W.

Wednesday May 18 This day fresh breezes from SE with rain and squally at day light we commence cutting whale at 4 P.M. we finished and clear up the head and start fire Antonio Andrade fell better still of duty pump attended to. No observation.

Thursday May 19 This day light wind from SE and cloudy weather vessel under shorting sails on Starboard tack boiling. Antonio Andrade, fell better still of duty pump attended to. Lat 24° 16 Long 62° 03 W.

Friday May 20 This day very light wind from SE with clear weather vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack heading NE, we finished boiling, and stow down oils pump attended to. No observation.

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Saturday May 21 This day very light wind from NE and clear weather, vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack heading North, we wash the vessel in side Antonio Andrade off duty sick pump attended to. Lat 26° 41 N Long 62° 06 W.

Sunday May 22 This day very light wind with calm vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack heading NE, Antonio Andrade, off duty sick with ail injury on the neck by bomb lance. pump attended to. Lat 27° 41 N Long 62° 39' 30" W.

Monday May 23 This day dead calm in morning at noon spring up a breeze from SE with clear weather, vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack steering East at 2: P.M. we pass by red buoy with (N. 2 = mark), we lower the boat Capt went there and caught plenty of fish and returned on board at 3: P.M. and we hoist the boat up Antonio Andrade, fell very bad pump attended to. No observation.

Tuesday May 24 This day light breeze from SE with clear weather, vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack steering East, crew making senate. At 8:30 P.M. Antonio Andrade, died. pump attended to. Lat 28° 17 N Long 60° 53 W.

Wednesday May 25 This day fresh breezes from SE and cloudy weather, vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack steering East. At 9 clock A.M. we buried the body of Antonio Andrade all of the crew fell very sorrowful pump attended to. Lat 28° 55 N Long 59° 43 W.
