Friday May 27 This day very light wind with calm. Vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack heading NE - crew making pennant pump attended to.

Saturday May 28 This day dead calm all day we repairing the fore-top sail and band on again pump attended to.

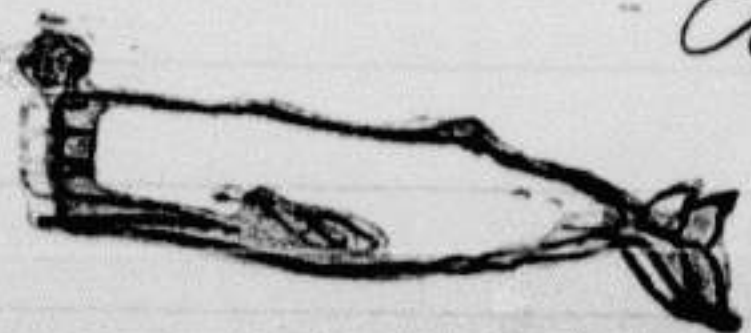
Lat 32° 20' N Long 57° 30' W

May 29 This day very light wind from SE with clear weather, vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack heading East - Pump attended to.

Lat 32° 33' N Long 55° 27' W

Monday May 30 This day dead calm with very light air. Vessel under all sail set on Starboard tack, at 1 clock P.M. we raised a school of small whales. We lower two boats - we struck four whales saw one S.B. - S.B. struck but iron drew out, loses whale. we take the whale along side at 4.30 P.M. and we put gear up ready to cut in the next morning - we shorting sails pump attended to.

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Tuesday May 31 This day very light wind from SE. With calm at daylight, we start to cutting whale at 7: clock we finished cutting and we took gear down and start the fire - at 7:30 P.M. we finished boiling pump attended to.

Lat 35° 11' N Long 53° 03' W

Wednesday June 1 This day very light breeze from SE. With clear weather, vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack heading E by S. We stow down the oils and stow off the hole and wash the vessel in side, at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to.

Lat 32° 20' N Long 52° 01' W

Thursday June 2 This day fresh breeze from the SE with clear weather, at day light we made all sails on Starboard tack heading E. The "Platina" in sight in morning, and other bark to the windward, suppose to be "Grayhound" - at 4:30 P.M. we raised a school of Bull Whales to the windward to far we did not lower the boats at sun set we shorting sails wore ship on Port tack pump attended to.

Lat 32° 43' N Long 51° 16' W

Friday June 3 This day fresh breeze from SE with clear weather vessel under main topsails, fore sails and head sails standing to the East on Starboard tack. Saw a Steamer bound to West.

Lat 32° 40' N Long 51° 16' W

Saturday June 4 This day fresh breeze from SE. With rough sea on vessel under shorting sails on Starboard tack, heading E by S. Pump attended to.
