Sunday July 3. This day very strong breezes from SW and clear with rough sea on vessel under reef fore sail, main trysails and Jib. on Port tack heading WNW at noon we were ship on Starboard tack. Saw a Schooner to the windward of us vessel back quit late but pump attended to.

Monday July 4. This day fresh breezes from SW and clear weather still under shorting sails on Starboard tack heading SE we fell one pig at sun set we shorting sails here to for night pump attended to.

Lat 33:20 N Long 47:53 W

Tuesday July 5. This day light SW wind and clear atmosphere in morning we made all sails on Port tack standing on Windward at 3:30 P.M. we raised a school of Small Whales to the windward of us to later we did not lower the boats, at sun set we shorting sails here to for the night pump attended to.

Wednesday July 6. This day light wind from SW and atmosphere clear at day light we made all sails on Starboard tack heading SE at 9:40 we were ship on Port tack heading West at 11:40 A.M. we raised a large whale going quick to the windward we did not lower the Boats at sun set we shorting sails here to for the night pump attended to.

Manta" ("Comes" "Downer" in sight to the leeward at 8:30 A.M. the John Manta lower the Boats a Peter Whales she got a Small Whale at sun set we shorting sails and here to for the night

Friday July 8. This day light wind from East and clear weather at day light we made all sails on Starboard tack running off stern NW. "D. Sawyer" and "Manta" in sight in morning at noon the went out right at sun down we shorting sails here to for the night

Saturday July 9. This day very light wind from East and smoky in morning we made all sails on Port tack standing to SE - saw a Whaling Bark to the leeward at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to.

Lat 33:25 N Long 49:19 W

Sunday July 10. First part of this day dead calm with smoky weather, vessel under trysails (laying round) Whaling Bark and Schooner to the leeward boiling pump attended to.

Lat 33:45 N Long 49:25 W

Monday July 11. First part of this day dead calm later part light wind from NW and clear weather "Comes" and two more Whales in sight at 6:30 P.M. the "Comes" lower two Boats a Peter Whales did not get any at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to.

Lat 33:51 N Long 49:23 W
