Saturday August 27 This day fresh breezes from East and cloudy atmosphere. Vessel under all sails set on Port tack, beating to the windward. Bertha in sight at noon. Pump attended to.

Sunday August 28 This day fresh breezes from East with rain and rough sea on Vessel under low sails on Port tack - heading S E pump attended to - no observation

Monday August 29 This day fresh breezes from East and cloudy atmosphere. Vessel under low sails, beating to windward, crew making pinnate - pump attended to.

Tuesday August 30 This day fresh breezes from S E - with squally and rain. Vessel under main topsails fore sails and head sails on Starboard tack, heading E N E at 8:30 A.M. we raised a school of small whales we lowered two boats, got one of them S.B. we take this whale along side at noon and we put gear up ready to cut in we start cutting in and we didn't finished pump attended to.



Wednesday August 31 This day moderate wind with cloudy in morning we start cutting whale at noon we finished and start fire saw clear up the head, Whaling new ^{Viola} Brig. pass near to us in morning bound to Eastward. Pump attended to.

Thursday September 1 This day very strong southerly wind with rough sea on Vessel under main topsails reef fore sails and set on Starboard tack heading S E pump attended to. We hoisting

Lat 38:06 W Long 37:18 W

Friday September 2 This day very strong wind from S W - and clear weather with rough sea on Vessel under shorting sails on Starboard tack, steer S E we finished hoisting and stow down oib and bar some on deck pump attended to.

Lat 38:26 W Long 31:56 W

Saturday September 3 This day light wind from Westerly and clear weather. Vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack, steer S E by E for Fajal, Schoner in sight to the West of us, suppose to be whaler, at sun set dead calm we shorting sails pump attended to.

Lat 38:31 W Long 30:55 W

Sunday September 4 This day strong breezes from N E with squally Vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack, beating up to windward bound to Fajal - Bark, Bertha in sight to leeward, pump attended to. We raised three large whale, lower the boats didn't get any coal returned on board.

Lat 38:29 W Long 29:46 W

Monday September 5 This day strong Easterly wind with rough sea on Vessel under low sails on Port tack heading S E by S Bertha in sight to the leeward. Crew clean the Vessel in side pump attended to.
