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Tuesday October 4 at Fayal with fresh breezes from South and rough sea on we working on repair the tryworks

Wednesday October 5 at Fayal with moderate wind and clear weather crew employed on setting up the rigging

Thursday October 6 at Fayal with light wind and clear weather crew employed on painting the vessel outside

Friday October 7 at Fayal with light wind from East and clear we discharge 3 seamen, John Favares, Quirim Pereira, John A. Soares and 2 desert, Jose J. Corvello & Constantino Cardoso

Saturday October 8 at Fayal with light wind from East and clear weather we give liberty to crew on watch West Shore

Sunday October 9 at Fayal with light wind from East and clear weather the watch returned on board and the other went shore

Monday 10 at 2^{1/2} P.M. we sail from Fayal with light wind from NE and clear weather, the tug boat tow us out about 2 miles from dock at 3 o'clock the tug left us and we steer SSW with all sails set on Port tack. At 6: P.M. we found one stowaway, name Jose Garcia. We unbanded the cables and stowed them way pumps attended to. J. Towner, in sight to the lancha No observation
