Manta, with 70 barrels, since left and saw harp mate at sun set we shorting sails pumps attended to

Monday January 2 This day dead calm all day vessel under no sails set crew employed on repair the sails John Manta and 2 merchant man in sight pumps attended to

Tuesday January 3 This day very strong wind from S.E. with rough sea on vessel under shorting sails, on Port tack heading S.E. saw a merchant man bound to St. Louis at 4: P.M. we raised a school of small whales we did not lower the boat in account of the weather - pumps attended to

Wednesday January 4 This day moderate wind from S.W. with heavy swell from S.W. and squally vessel under shorting sails on Port tack standing on windward pumps attended to

Thursday January 5 This day fresh S.E. wind with heavy swell from South vessel under try sails fore sails and head sails standing on windward on Starboard tack crew making ribnet at 6:30 P.M. we raised a large whale the boat was to later at sun set we take in fore sails set fore try sails, pumps attended to

Friday January 6 This day fresh breezes from S.E. and squally vessel under two try sails and full on Starboard tack standing on windward in morning we sighted the Whaling Schooner "J. Towner" at 7:30 P.M. we lower the boat the Capt went aboard of her and returned at 6:30 P.M. we were ship to Westward pumps attended to

Saturday January 7 This day light breezes from East with clear weather in morning we made all sails on Port tack heading S.E. "J. Towner" in sight at 4:30 P.M. we raised a three bull whale we lower three boats the W.B. struck one of them and two boats smash, the S.B. killed the whale we take this whale along side at 10:30 P.M. and all the gear belong to boat we saved - but boat can not be fix pumps attended to

Lat 23:00 S Long 48:43 W

Sunday January 8 This day light S.W. wind with clear weather at daylight we put gear up and commenced cutting in whale at noon we finished cutting in and we send gear down and we start the fire and we short long sails "J. Towner" in sight in morning
