Monday January 9 This day fresh SW wind with rough sea on vessel under main topsails and set on Port tack heading NW by W we hoisting at 6:30 AM we were ship to Southward pump attended to
No observation

Tuesday January 10 This day light NE wind with clear weather vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack heading North we finished hoisting and stow down the sail, "Towner" in sight to the windward at sun set we shorting sail pump attended to
Lat 33° 05' S Long 48° 46' W

Wednesday January 11 This day very strong NE wind with rough sea on vessel under two by sails and set on Port tack head SSE vessel reefed the boat pump attended to
Lat 33° 16' S Long 49° 10' W

Thursday January 12 This day blowy gale from NE with rough sea on vessel under two by sails on Port tack standing on windward at 6:30 AM heavy rain struck with squally we were bound on Starboard tack pump attended to
No observation

Friday January 13 This day strong wind from NE with rain at 7:30 AM the wind shifted to NW with clear weather vessel under two by sails on Starboard tack heading NE "Towner" in sight to the leeward saw porpoises were making snout pump attended to
No observation

Saturday January 14 This day light SW wind with thick fog and rain vessel under main topsails fore sails and head sails running off steer NE saw a porpoise pump attended to
No observation sun obscure

Sunday January 15 This day light wind from NE sand foggy with rain all day vessel under all sails set on Port tack heading East saw a Grampus at 8:00 PM dead calm we take in main sails set main by sail pump attended to
No observation sun obscure

Monday January 16 This day strong SE wind with squall and heavy rain vessel under shorting sails on Starboard tack steer NE saw a porpoise at 7:30 PM the wind shifted to the North with heavy swell we wore ship on Port tack head East pump attended to
No observation sun obscure

Tuesday January 17 This day fresh breeze from SE with squall vessel under shorting sails on Starboard tack steer NE at noon we raised a school of small whale we lower two boats boat struck a young bull we take this whale along side at 4:30 PM and we put gear up ready to cutting the next morning pump attended to
Lat 32° 30' S Long 47° 03' W



Wednesday January 18 This day strong SE wind with heavy sea at 11 AM we start to cutting whale at noon we finished cutting and we set fire weather got better and moderate wind pump attended to
Lat 32° 00' S Long 46° 58' W
