Sunday March 26 This day light wind from the trade and clear vessel under all sails set on starboard tack falling up to Dominica, at 12: PM we anchor at Dominica in 8 fathom water found more vessel here pump attended to

Monday March 27 at Dominica with fine weather we wash the vessel in sight to painted

Tuesday March 28 at Dominica with fine weather we paint the vessel outside and pump out some salt water pump attended to

Wednesday March 29 at Dominica with fine weather we take some water on board

Thursday March 30 at Dominica with light NE wind and clear atmosphere

Friday March 31 at Dominica with dead - very light wind from trade and clear weather Richard W. Clark arrived from New Bedford with 11 days

Saturday April 1 at Dominica with fine weather we taking some stuff on board the Clark.

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Sunday April 2 at Dominica with calm and clear weather

Monday April 3 at Dominica with fine weather and clear atmosphere the crew working on board "Clark" to unload the vessel

Tuesday April 4 at Dominica with light wind from the trade and clear atmosphere

Friday April 7 at Dominica with light NE wind and clear atmosphere, we took some boxes on board from "Clark"

Sunday April 9 at Dominica with fine weather one watch went shore in morning and returned board at noon and the other went
