Sunday June 4 This day very light wind from NE and cloudy. Picked under all sails set on Port tack standing to the windward. Saw a stormer bound to Eastward at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to

Monday June 5 This day dead calm all forenoon at 3: P.M. spring up a breeze from SW we made all sails on Port tack steer East at 7: P.M. we came with "A. M. Nickelson" and we shorting sails and leave to for the night - Pump attended to

Lat 37° 15' N Long 73° 03' W

Tuesday June 6 This day began with dead calm at noon saw a school of Black fish we lower three boats we caught 2 SB-1- LB-1- at 3: P.M. spring up a breeze from NE with fog we head East on Port tack "Nickelson" lower two boats, didn't got any pump attended to two merchant man in sight

Wednesday June 7 This day very light wind from NE with thick fog in morning we set foresail and flying jib on Port tack head East at 10:30 A.M. weather clear up some we set main sails and let topsail "A. M. Nickelson" by our company at 2:30 P.M. the Nickelson raised a school of small whale, she lower three boats and we lower three we didn't got any Nickelson got 1 small whale the boat returned on board we shorting sail Whales went S.E.

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Thursday June 8 This day very strong breeze from NE with rough sea on Russell under shorting sails on starboard tack heading NWW the "Nickelson" in sight to the leeward at 11: A.M. we raised a school of small whale, going to the windward quick we didn't lower the boats in account of weather at 3: P.M. we were ship on Port tack pump attended to

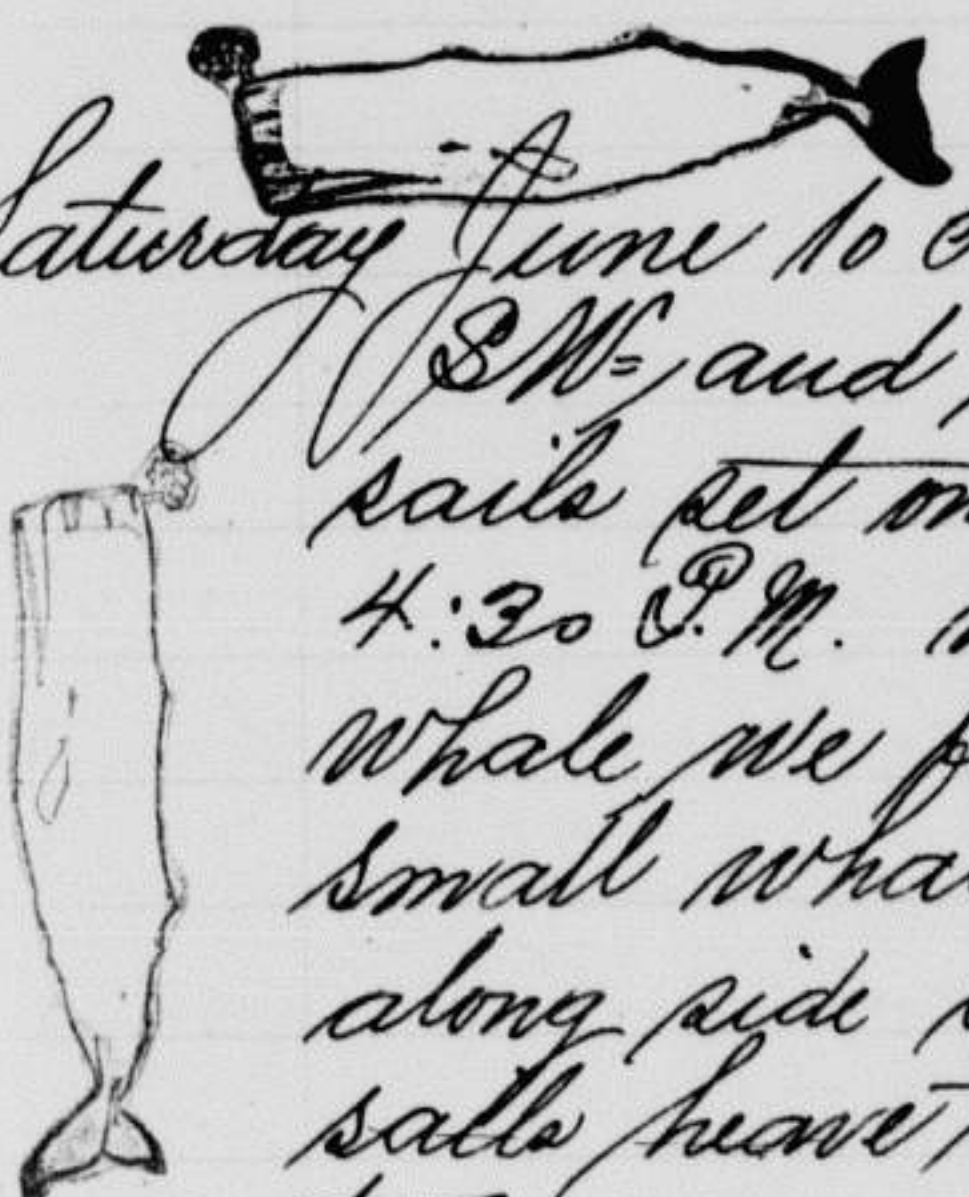


Lat 37° 15' N Long 72° 16' W

Friday June 9 This day strong NE wind with large sea Russell under two topsail and jib on starboard tack heading NWW the A. M. Nickelson in sight in morning she went out sight at 11: A.M. bore NW from us pump attended to - Saw lot of porpoises pump attended to

Saturday June 10 This day very light wind from SW and clear weather Russell under all sails set on Port tack steer NW at 4:30 P.M. we raised a school of small whale we lower three boats caught two small whale LB-1- WB-1- took the whale along side at 7: P.M. and we shorting sails leave to for the night pump attended to



Lat 37° 30' N Long 71° 41' W

Sunday June 11 This day began with very light wind from SW and rain at day light we set main sails and start to cutting in whale at 7: A.M. we finished cutting in and made all sails standing to by North at 9: A.M. we raised school of small whale we lower three boats got 2 small whale SB-1- WB-1- took the whale along side at noon, and we got dinner and and let gears up at 1: P.M.
