 and foggy at day light we made all
 sails on Starboard tack heading SW-
 at noon we wore ship on Port tack
 Saw lots of porpoises, at sun set we
 shorting sails pump attended to

Monday June 19 This day light wind from NE
 and clear atmosphere in morning we made
 all sails on Port tack standing to the SE -
 whaling schooner to the SW of us going on Starboard
 tack at 9: A.M. we raised a school of small
 whale, going East, quick we lower three boats
 can not head them off, they went out right to
 the boats returned on board, at 1: P.M. we
 raised an other school going SW- we lower
 3 boats got two of them L.B.-1-S.B.-1-
 take this whale along side at 4: P.M. and
 we put gear up and commence cutting at
 6:30 we finished cutting and clear up the
 head we shorting sails pump attended to

Tuesday June 20 This day began with calm
 and clear weather Breeze under main
 trysails and head sails boiling
 at 7:30 P.M. saw a steamer towing barge
 bound to SW- at 3: P.M. Spring Up, a
 breeze from SW- we wore ship on Port tack
 pump attended to

 NW wind and clear weather, Breeze under
 two trysails and full on Port tack standing
 on windward at 5 P.M. moderate wind and
 heavy swell we running pump attended to

 NW-Wind and clear atmosphere in
 morning we made all sails on Port tack
 heading NW & E Saw lots of porpoises
 at sun set we shorting sails pump attended
 to

 and clear weather in morning we made
 all sails on Starboard tack heading WSW-
 Saw lots of porpoises, at sun set we shorting
 sails pump attended to

 Breeze under two trysails on laying
 around, at noon spring up a
 breeze from NW we made all sails
 on Starboard tack head West
 at sun set we shorting sails pump
 attended to

 breeze from SW and cloudy at day light
 we made all sails on Port tack head
 West at 4:30 P.M. we came with
 A.M. "Nickelson" at sun set shorting
 sails pump attended to
