Wednesday June 28 this day began with light air and calm vessel under main topsails fore sails and jib on Starboard tack  
A. M. "Nickelson" in sight at sun set we take in fore sails set fore topsails - pumps attended to

Thursday June 29 This day fresh breezes from NW and smoky vessel under all sails set on Port tack. Steer East at 4: P.M. we raised a school of small whale - we lower three boats caught one SB = looking along side at 6: P.M. and we shorting sails pumps attended to

Friday June 30 This day light wind from NW and clear weather, at daylight we set main sails and start to cutting at 7: A.M. we finished cutting and took gear down, and we made all sails running at sun set shorting sails and start fire pumps attended to

We finished boiling saw a lot of porpoises - at sun set we shorting sails pumps attended to

Sunday July 2 This day light SW wind clear weather in morning we raised a school of small whale we lower three boats - caught 3 small whale 6 B = 1 = SB = 1 = WB = 1 = took three whales along side at 2: P.M. and we put gear up and start to cutting at 6: P.M. we finished cutting and we shorting sails and start fire pumps attended to

Monday July 3 This day light SW wind and clear atmosphere vessel under main sail and head sails on Port tack, boiling. At noon we sighted a Whaling schooner to the leeward of us - at 2: P.M. she went out sight saw a Grampus at sun set we shorting sails pumps attended to

Tuesday July 4 This day light SW wind and clear atmosphere at daylight we made all sails on Starboard tack heading SE  
Saw lots of porpoises & Whaling schooner in sight at 6: P.M. we finished boiling and we put some oil down at sun set we shorting sails pumps attended to
