Friday July 14 This day light SW wind and clear atmosphere, at day light we made all sails on Starboard tack heading South at 3 P.M. weather got squally and rain we shorting sails pump attended to

Saturday July 15 This day light wind from SW and clear, in morning we made all sails on Starboard tack heading S.E. at noon we came with schooner "J. Towne" at 2:30 P.M. we raised school of small whale. We lower three boats "J. Towne" lower three boats we got one small whale - W.B. - taking this whale along side at 4:30 P.M. and hoist the boats up shorting sails pump attended to

Sunday July 16 This day light wind from SW and clear atmosphere. Dred under all sails set on Starboard tack, at 7 P.M. we finished cutting whale, and saw "Bertha" with boats down and we lower three boats, didn't get any - Bertha caught one small whale at 2:30 P.M. we came with "Bertha" and "Wickerson", at sun set we shorting sails, and start fire pump attended to

Lat 36:59 N Long 74:00 W

Monday July 17 This day light wind and clear at 6 A.M. we finished baling and we made all sails on Starboard tack. Saw a three schooner with boats down, sharing whales we did not lower the boats - at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to. No observation sun obscure

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Tuesday July 18 This day light NE wind and clear atmosphere at day light we made all sails on Port tack cruising "Bertha" and two more schooner in sight in morning at noon they went out eight saw lots of porpoises. Pump at sun set we shorting sails and wore ship on Starboard tack pump attended to

Wednesday July 19 This day began with light NE wind and clear atmosphere in morning we made all sails on Port tack standing to South - all whaling schooner in sight at noon at 1 P.M. they went out eight bearing NW from us, at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to

Lat 36:28 N Long 73:54 W

Thursday July 20 This day began with dead calm and clear weather, at 6 A.M. we raised a school of small whale we lower three boats caught young bull - L.B. - taking along side at 1:30 P.M. and we put gear up and commenced cutting fat. At 3 P.M. we finished cutting and took gear down and start fire "Bertha" and "J. Towne" in sight also got one whale each - at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to

Lat 36:42 N Long 74:09 W

Friday July 21 This day began with fresh SW wind and squally. Dred under shorting sails on Starboard tack heading South at 7:30 A.M. we finished baling. Bark "Bertha" and "Wheland" in sight to the windward. Pump attended to

Lat 36:50 N Long 74:22 W
