fore sails, topsails and st. - at 1 P.M. we
came with "John P. Manta". Pico in sight
pump attended to

Saturday August 31 this day fresh Easterly
wind vessel under shorting sails
"Manta" in sight pump attended to

Sunday ~~August 31~~ ^{Sept 1} this day light SE wind
clear weather vessel under shorting
sails Fayal in sight pump attended to

Monday Sept 2, this day light SE wind clear
vessel under shorting sails "Manta" in
sight and Fayal also in sight
pump attended to

Tuesday Sept 3 this day light Easterly
wind and clear atmosphere
vessel under all sails set on Starboard
tack "Manta" in sight at sun set
shorting sails pump attended to
No observation

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Wednesday September 4 this day fresh breeze
from SE and clear atmosphere
vessel under main topsails fore sail and
head sails on Starboard tack at 2 P.M.
we sighted the schooner "Richard W. Clark"
Fayal in sight about 8 miles off
No observation

Thursday September 5 this fresh breeze from
SE and clear weather vessel under
low sails, steve to Fayal at 10: come
to anchor at Fayal. found Sch. "T. J. Lawrence"
in sight and "John Manta" arrived the
same day we marring the vessel
with four chains and one watch
went on shore =

Friday Sept 6 at Fayal with fine weather
wash the vessel in sight

Saturday Sept 7 at Fayal with light Easterly
wind we painted the vessel outside

Sunday Sept 8 at Fayal with light SE
wind

Monday Sept 9 at Fayal with fresh SE wind
crew employed on scree the Iron Works

Tuesday Sept 10 at Fayal with fine weather
commence to crock out oil

Wednesday Sept 11, at Fayal with fine weather -
we shipped one lighter of oil to R. W. Clark

Thursday Sept 12 at Fayal with light wind
from SE - we took provisions on board
Joseph Lynch, Fred. J. Eneau, Cornelius Crowley -
desert from ship
