and at 2 PM we finished at 4.30 PM
spoke to "Mystic" with 220 barrels oil
at sun set took in main sails set main
trysails pump attended to start fire

Lat 34° 47' N Long 44° 52' W =
"Mystic" Long 46° 15' = diff = 82 miles

Friday July 26 this day light wind from SE
and clear weather vessel under shorting
sails on port tack head SEW - we finished
boiling Mystic in sight at sun set we shorting
sails at 10:30 PM the 2nd mate died
pump attended to

Saturday July 27 this day light wind from SE
and clear weather vessel under all
sails set cruising at 9 AM. We have to
and buried the 2nd mate every body fell
sorry for him - at sun set we shorting
sails pump attended to

Sunday July 28 this day light wind from SW
and clear weather vessel under all
sails set on starboard tack cruising
at sun set we shorting sails pump
attended to

Lat 35° 20' N Long 43° 58' W

every other night

and starting fire

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Monday July 29 this day very light wind
from SE and clear atmosphere
vessel under all sails set on port tack
cruising at sun set we shorting sails
pump attended to

Lat 35° 24' N Long 44° 18' W

Tuesday July 30 this day fresh SE wind and
clear vessel under shorting sails standing
on windward on starboard tack pump
attended to

Lat 35° 00' N Long 44° 50' W

Wednesday July 31 this day fresh SE wind
and clear weather vessel under land
sails on port tack cruising at sun
set we shorting sails pump attended to

Lat 34° 38' N Long 45° 10' W

Thursday August 1st this day light wind
from SW and clear weather vessel
under all sail set on starboard
tack cruising at sun set we shorting
sails pump attended to

Lat 34° 32' N Long 45° 08' W

Saturday
Friday August 2nd this day light wind from
SE and clear weather vessel under
all sails set on port tack cruising
at 11:30 AM. We raised a large whale
going to windward, we raising
we did not lower the boats at sun set
we shorting sails pump attended to
