Sunday August 3rd This day light wind from SW and clear weather vessel under all sails set on Port tack cruising at 7.30 P.M. we raised a school of small whale we lower three boats caught 3 of them W.B. = 1 = S.B. = 1 = W.B. = 1 = take the whale along side at 3.30 P.M. and we start cutting at 10th P.M. we finished cutting and clear up the head and start fire shorting sails pump attended to

Lat 34° 30' N Long 44° 45' W

Monday August 4th This day fresh breeze from SE and clear weather vessel under topsails and head sails on Starboard tack (boiling) at sun set we were ship on Port tack pump attended to

Lat 34° 36' N Long 44° 55' W

Tuesday August 5th This day fresh breeze from SW and clear atmosphere at day light we made all sails on Port tack - and we finished boiling at 6.30 A.M. we raise a large whale we lower 2 boats and W.B. struck him we take the whale along side at 3.30 P.M. and we stow down some oil and put gears up ready to cutting the next morning and we shorting sails pump attended to

Lat 34° 40' N Long 44° 48' W

Wednesday August 6th This day dead calm all day in morning we start cutting whale at 3 P.M. we finished and we start fire pump attended to

Lat 34° 30' N Long 44° 54' W

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Thursday August 7th This day very light wind from SW and clear weather vessel under main topsails on Port tack boiling pump attended to

Lat 34° 36' N Long 44° 40' W

Friday August 8th This day calm with light air vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack. We finished boiling at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to

Lat 34° 45' N Long 44° 39' W

Saturday August 9th This day fresh breeze from SW and clear weather in morning we made all sails on Starboard tack - and S.W. at 2 P.M. we came to "Bertha Nickerson" and we raised a large whale we lower one boat the other lower three we chase him all afternoon. Whale fell the boats went away at 6.30 the boats returned on board - we shorting sails pump attended to

Lat 33° 42' N Long 44° 34' W

Sunday August 10th This day good breeze from SW and clear weather vessel under all sails set on Port tack cruising at sun set (we shorting sails "Nickerson" in sight) pump attended to

Lat 34° 57' N Long 44° 24' W

Monday August 11th This day light wind from SW and clear weather vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack head South at 10 A.M. we raised three large whale we lower two boats W.B. struck him and we take along side at noon and we made room for oil and stow down we shorting sails pump attended to "Nickerson" went out of sight
