Wednesday Sept 22. This day begin with light easterly
wind and clear weather vessel under
all sails set on the Port tack steering
S.E. by S. at 8 a.m. sight the
island of Tenerife about 15 miles off
two whaling vessels in sight. Barque
and schooner Lat: 29 05. N Long: 16.37. W.

Thursday Sept. 23. This day moderate wind from E
and clear weather. Vessel under all sails
set on the Port tack.
At 11 A.M. we anchor at Las Palmas

Friday ^{Sept.} 24. This day fine weather
and clear, vessel buchar at Las
Palmas.

Saturday Sept 25. At Las Palmas with light
breezes and clear weather.

Sunday Sept. 26. This day moderate wind
from N.E. and squally weather

Monday Sept. 27. At Las Palmas with fine
weather and clear.

Tuesday Sept. 28. At Las Palmas with calm
and clear weather.

Wednesday Sept. 29. This day begin with light
N.E. wind and clear weather.

Thursday Sept. 30. At Las Palmas with fine and
