

Remarks on the board & shore: C.B

Sat.
May 27th. 1916 p.m. Steady breeze and
very squally to the westward wind
from S. all sails set. Saw nothing
Watch employed on ship duty.
at 7 o'clock short her down to
trysail and running to the northward
pumps & side light carefully attended.
End of day. (Lat: 32.26 N.
Lon: 50.34 W)

Sun:

May 28th. 1916

This day strong breeze and squally
with rain at 4 p.m. do weather
wind from W ship on small sail
Saw nothing. Watch employed on
ship duty. pumps & side light
carefully attended. End of day
No observation

Mon:

May 29th. 1916

This day strong breeze and high sea.
Weather very clear ship on small sail
at 5-40 a.m. Met. Perry saw a spout
and lost sight of it at 9 a.m. Captain
saw it again about 5 times run
ship to it but never see it any
more. at 7 p.m. wore round to the
starboard tack let her lay.
pumps & side light carefully attended.
End of day. (Lat: 33.12 N.
Lon: 49.58 W)

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Tues:

May 30th. 1916

This day began with light
breeze set all the sails at p.m.
strong breeze taking all the sails
set trysail. wore round on starboard
tack. pumps & side light carefully
attended. Watch employed on
ship duty. Saw nothing. End of day
(Lat: 33.42 N.
Lon: 49.33 W)

Wed:

May 31st. 1916

This day steady breeze from NW
and fine clear weather at 11 a.m.
Captain saw school of whales
drop down the boat. Mr. Perry
struck one came aboard get
ready putting the whale short
her down to main trysail
end of day. (Lat: 33.64 N.
Lon: 49.20 W)



Thurs:

June 1st. 1916

This day calm all day & clear weather
Watch employed trying up. pumps &
side light carefully attended.
Saw nothing end of day. (Lat: 33.40 N.
Lon: 49.00 W)

Fri:

June 2nd. 1916

This day light breeze
and fine clear weather wind from NE all
sails out. Saw Grampas and other fish
at 7 o'clock short her down to trysail
let lay on port tack. pumps & side
light carefully attended. end of day
(Lat: 33.51 N. Lon: 48.56 W)
