Sat: 3rd

1916 This day began with light breeze and fine clear weather wind from NE all sails set. at p.m. fresh breeze and Cloudy looking saw Steamer & several log boats by. at 7 o'clock short her down to try sail let her lay on port tack. pump & side light - Carefully attended. end of day.

Lat: 34.02 N.
Lon: 48.54 W.

June
Sun: 4th

1916 This began with light breeze and big swell weather very clear at p.m. Cloudy and very smooth. wind from NE ship on small sails. saw fin back porpoises & grampas. Watch employed on ship duty. pump & side light - Carefully attended. End of day.

Lon: 47.59 W.

June
Mon: 5th

1916 This day light breeze and fine clear weather wind from E all sails set. saw Steamer bound to NW. Watch employed breakfast water and stowed down oil 23 barrel. pump & side light Carefully attended. at 4 o'clock short her down to try sail let her lay on starboard tack. End of day.

Lat: 33.27 N.
Lon: 47.53 W.

June
Tues: 6th

1916 This day steady breeze and fine clear weather wind from E all sails set. at 9.50 a.m. Antonio Gomes saw a large whale drop down the boat. Mr. Perry got him came aboard get ready clear the head & cutting the body. let head remain long side end of day. Lat: 34.02 N. Lon: 48.10 W.

1916 This light breeze and generally with light rain. Employed trying out & cutting the whale head. saw nothing. pump carefully attended. end of day. no observation

June
Thurs: 8th

1916 This day began with light breeze and fine clear weather wind from NW. at p.m. very Cloudy. Watch employed finish try out. at 7 o'clock short her down to try sail let her lay on starboard tack. pump & side light - Carefully attended. End of this day.

Lat: 34.29 N.
Lon: 48.31 W.

June
Frid: 9th

1916 This day Fresh breeze and clear weather wind from NW ship crossing on the small sail. saw four Boaster Schooner bound E. Watch employed on ship duty. pump & side light - Carefully attended. End of day.

Lat: 34.23 N.
Lon: 47.53 W.

June
Sat: 10th

1916 This day began with strong breeze and high sea at 5.40 a.m. Mr. Oliver saw school whales drops down the boat. Mr. Perry struck one Mr. Benson one Mr. Oliver one. and we have had time of it. we got the last whale board at 12 o'clock at night. end of day
