July  
Thurs: 20<sup>th</sup>: 1916 This day steady breeze and fine clear weather wind from W. all sails set. Saw nothing. Watch employed on ship duty. pump & side light - carefully attended. At 7 o'clock shot her down to try sails let lay on starboard tack. End of day.

July

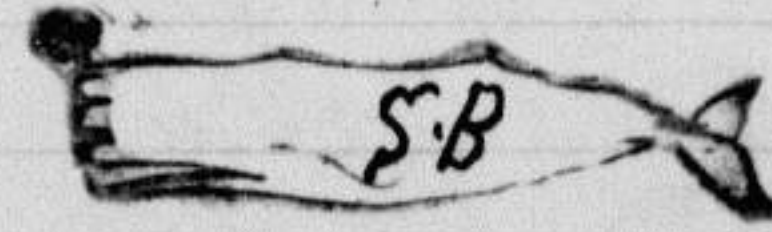
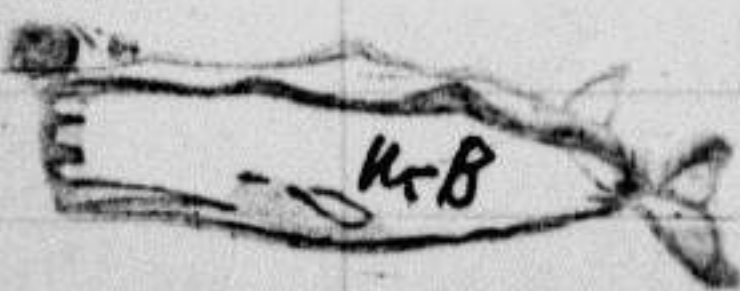
Wed: 21<sup>st</sup>: 1916 This began with steady breeze at a.m. ~~Squally~~ Squally with rain after rain at 9.20 a.m. Mr. Oliver saw 3 large whales drop the boat chasing all day. never got any. Came board & shot her down to try sails let her lay on starboard tack end of day. (Lat: 34.04 N.)  
(Lon: 45.09 W.)

July

Sat: 22<sup>nd</sup>: 1916 This day calm & clear weather. Saw nothing. Watch employed on ship duty. pump & side light - carefully attended. End of day. no observation.

July

Sun: 23<sup>rd</sup>: 1916 This day calm all day at 4.05 p.m. Mr. Oliver saw school of whales drop the boat Mr. Perry struck a large whale line got full and parted lost it. Second Mate struck 2 third Mate one. Came board at 9.30 p.m. end of day. no observation.



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July

Mon: 24<sup>th</sup>: 1916 This day light breeze and fine clear weather wind from NE. Employed finish cutting the whales. started to try out. stowed down some oil 36 barrel. End of day.

July

Tues: 25<sup>th</sup>: 1916 This day fresh breeze and fine clear weather wind from NE. Ship on small sails. Employed set up cast and other duty. Saw nothing. pump & side light - carefully attended. End of day. (Lat: 33.55 N.)  
(Lon: 44.11 W.)

July

Wed: 26<sup>th</sup>: 1916 This day strong breeze & squally with light rain. Wind from NE. Ship on short sails. Saw nothing. Watch employed on ship duty. pump & side light carefully attended. End of day. (Lat: 34.00 N.)  
(Lon: 46.23 W.)

July

Thurs: 27<sup>th</sup>: 1916 This day strong breeze and clear weather wind from E ship on small sails. Saw two vessels one bound to SW another bound to NE. at 11.40 a.m. Alfredo Santo saw a large whale drop down the boat Mr. Perry struck and boat got board at 2 p.m. got ready cutting the whale finish at 8 p.m. end of day. (Lat: 34.06 N.)  
(Lon: 47.27 W.)
