

July 28th 1916
 Remarks on the board schooner Carleton bell.

This day steady breeze and fine clear weather wind from SE. Saw steamer bound W. Watch employed tryant and stowed down 70 barrel of oil. End of day. (Lat: 34.19 N. Lon: 47.59 W.)

July 29th 1916

This day strong breeze and squally wind from S ship on short-sails. Saw school of black fish & paper. Watch employed on ship duty. finish tryant. pumps & side light carefully attended. End of day. (Lat: 34.23 N. Lon: 48.45 W.)

July 30th 1916

This day began with strong breeze and squally with rain wind from S. Ship laying on short sails at 4 p.m. do weather set for sail. Saw steamer bound W. and two master schooner look like whaler she was on short-sails. Watch employed on ship duty. pumps & side light carefully attended. End of day. (Lat: 34.34 N. Lon: 47.10 W.)

July 31 1916

This day fresh breeze and clear weather wind from SW ship on small sails. at 11.30 a.m. we gained with schooner Margaret she have 200 barrel & report - Viola 5.20. Woodroff 2.50. Gryhound 3.60. on James Wandra 1.40 3rd July. Thicket 4.00 20 of July. Valkyrie 1.60. Alice Knot. 2.00. Nickolsen 1.30. Bertha 2.60. at 7.0 clock short her down to try sails let her lay on starboard tack end of day. (Lat: 34.39 N. Lon: 48.25 W.)

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August

Tues: 1st 1916 This day strong breeze and hazy weather wind from SW. Ship laying on short-sails. Margaret & Woodroff in sight. pumps & side light - carefully attended. end of day. no observation.

August Wed: 2nd 1916

This began with heavy gale wind & squally with rain wind from SW at 4 p.m. wind haled to westward saw one vessel on short-sails. Ship making lots water pumps & side light - carefully attended. End of day. no observation.

Aug:

Thurs: 3rd 1916

This day strong gale wind & cloudy night. Sea running wind from NE. ship running to the westward. Saw two schooner laying to on short-sails. lots water shipping on deck. pumps & side light carefully attended. End of day. (Lat: 33.46 N. Lon: 49.41 W.)

Aug:

Frid: 4th 1916

This day strong wind and clear weather wind from E ship trying to the westward. on small sails. Watch employed on ship duty. Saw black fish. pumps & side light - carefully attended. End of day. (Lat: 33.40 N. Lon: 51.32 W.)
