

Remarks on Board of the

Friday December the 27th 1844
First part of this day commences with
Moderate breezes from the E. S. E. Coors S. S. W.
With all possible sail clear weather & fine
Watch employed in Ships Duty Capt King is fitting
the blocks for the Spanish Borden & 4 pole
larks & fish lark & c. 2 sails in sight Middle
and later part the same

Saturday December the 28th 1844
This day strong winds from the E. S. E. Coors
S. S. W. With all possible sail set to hurry the
Ship Caspander to the river & flat middle
part Shift of Wind from W by N
Hedding S. S. W. Watch employed in Ships
Duty 2 men Watch stepped below for
fitting sails part the same so end the day

Sunday December the 29th 1844
This day strong winds from the S. West
staring by the Wind hedding S. S. E. Middle
part reefed the topsails & hoisted up the 2
bow boats later part turned out the
Reefed out the topsails so end the day

Monday December the 30th 1844
First part of this day strong winds from the S. W.
Hedding S. S. E. Middle part Shift of Wind from
E. S. E. Coors S. W. by S. Rough & hazy weather Watch
employed in Ships Duty & c. Single reef fore &
Mizzen topsails later part part set the main
top galant sail this end the day 24 hours

Tuesday December the 31st 1844
First part of this day very strong winds from
E. S. E. Coors S. W. by S. Cloudy & raining single reef
fore & mizzen topsails at 6. 3. 16. 16. in the fore
& mizzen topsails at 6. 16. 16. reefed the main
topsails & hoisted the ship to in gale of Wind middle & later
part the same

Ship Caspander of Providence R. I.

January Wednesday January the 1st 1845

First part of this day strong winds from
the W. S. W. Coors S. W. Sail in sight at the
12 o'clock toward a boat after a turtle but
did not get him it being a New Years day
& having a sea for dinner Middle part
cloudy & heavy showers of rain at
Sunset set to in sail on the River & flat
later part the same so end the day

Thursday January the 2nd 1845
First part of this day commences with strong
winds from W. S. W. hedding S. Middle part
strong gales Watch & all hands employed
in sending up New fore & mizzen top
sails spoke the Bague Sarah of
Natickport & mizzen on oil not started
at 5. 1. 16. 16. reefed the main topsail
Line to under close reefed main topsail
& fore topmast stay sail Satter part
the same so end the day of 24 hours

Friday January the 3rd 1845
First part of this day strong gales & a
heavy sea Wind W. S. W. hedding S. W. all
hands employed in sending sails making
spun yarn Bloin heavy under close
reefed main topsail Middle & later part
Heard close reefed fore & main topsail
so end the day much the same

Saturday January the 4th 1845
First part of this day commences with strong
breezes from S. S. W. hedding S. E. Watch em-
ployed in braking out Water & c. Saw porpoises
the Bague Sarah in sight at 6. 1. 16. 16. Boat
born a gaming Middle & later part light
breezes so end the day
