

Remarks on Board of The Whale
Wednesday March the 5th 1845

First part of this day Strong Winds from the S.W. by S. hours N.W. by N. With the all Draining sail set. Keeping first part. Watch employed in Ships Duty. Middle part the same at 5 P.M. sent up the Mains. Royal yard & broke out the sails from for the Tacking. Latter part the same saw in South & Clearer so ends the day much the same.

Thursday March the 6th 1845
First part of this day Moderate Winds from the S.E. hours N.W. by N. With the all possible sail set. Capt employed in making a Locker on Deck. Watch employed in Ships Duty. Middle part the same saw Nothing. Latter part being took in 1 Lower Studding sail & rigged in the Boom so ends the Day of 24 hours.

Friday March the 7th 1845
First part of this day Moderate Winds from the E. by S. hours N.W. by N. With the all possible sail set. Watch employed in setting up the Royal & Jaland. Backstay to the Main brought 2 Brats for Water. Middle part the same at 2 P.M. for tripp. Raised & Spinn. White & Leonard 3 Boats the Starboard Boat started but did not fasten the Ring up & down. Landed up & after wards the Starboard Boat started twice but did not get far. The chase until Sunset & came aboard & kept the Ship two hours. 5 Spinn. White in sight at sun down Latter part the same so ends the Day.

Saturday March the 8th 1845
First part of this day Light Winds from S.E. hours N.W. by N. With the all possible sail set. Watch employed in Ships Duty. Middle part the same saw porpoises. Latter part took in the Lower Studding sail & Brose the yard line. So ends the day.

Sunday March the 9th 1845
First part of Strong Trade Winds from the S.E. hours N.W. by N. at sunrise went up to the mast head & saw a school of Grampuses. Middle part the same. Latter part Moderate Winds employed in Ships Duty at 4 P.M. took in the Lower Studding sail. So ends the Week the same.

Monday March the 10th 1845
First part of this day Strong Winds from the E.S.E. hours N.W. by N. With the all possible sail set. Watch employed in making Spinn. yarn saw a piece of Spinn. Squalid. Middle part the same. Latter part the same set the Main Royal. So ends the Day much the same.

Tuesday March the 11th
First part of this Strong Winds from the E.S.E. hours N.W. by N. Watch employed in mending Old Sails & broke part the same. Light Squalid. Capt. being employed in making a pump. Dream saw Nothing. Latter part the same. So ends the day.

Wednesday March the 12th 1845
First part of this day Strong Winds from the E.N.E. hours N.W. by N. With the all possible sail set. Watch employed in Broking out for Water at 12 P.M. took in the Main royal & Lower Studding sail. Middle part the same saw a very large school of Porpoises. Latter part finished broking out Water & stored down Riggs at 3 set the main & Royal. So ends the day.

Thursday March the 13th
First part of this day Moderate Winds from the E.N.E. hours N.W. by N. Watch employed in mending sail & broke part the same. Then on the Starboard list of striking & rigged. Latter part the same so ends the day much the same.
