

Remarks on Board of the Shark

Monday March the 24th 1845

First part of this day bold Watch employed in mending sails at 8 AM sent down the main topgallant sail to haul & at 11 sent it up again at 12 light Watch from the S.E. Coars N.W. With all sail set saw a Dimont fish middle & latter part the same so ends the day

Tuesday March the 25th

First part of this day light breeze from the S.E. Coars N.W. Watch employed in ship's duty & saw a Dimont fish Middle part the same saw porpoises both making puddles for the school boat. Rain latter part the same some specks of rain so ends the day much the same

Wednesday March the 26th 1845

First part of this day light Wind from the S.E. Coars N.W. by W. With all sail at 11.4 to ship's duty & braced up the yards Wind from the N by E brought a ship's pack Middle part the same & latter part the same Moderate so ends the day much the same

Thursday March the 27th 1845

First part of this day commenced with strong Wind from N.E. Coars N.W. by W. at 3 AM took in the main topgallant studding sail & bent a cross-jack sail Middle part the same & latter part the same set all the headsails so ends the day much the same

Friday March the 28th 1845

First part of this day moderate Wind from the N.E. Coars N.W. by W. With all possible sail Watch employed in braving out for W. Middle part the same latter part the same so ends the day much the same

Saturday March the 29th 1845

First part of this day strong Wind from the N.E. Coars N.W. by W. at 6 AM struck a porpoise but did not get him Watch employed in ship's duty Middle part the same saw large schools of porpoises & flying fish latter part the same so ends the day of 24 hours

Sunday March the 30th 1845

First part of this day strong Wind from the N.E. Coars N.W. by W. With all sail Middle part the same latter part the same saw nothing but a Dimont fish so ends the day much the same

Monday March the 31st 1845

First part of this day strong Wind from the N.E. by E Coars N.W. by W. Watch employed in ship's duty middle part the same at 2 put on a preventive backstay on the fore topgallant mast at 5 PM took in the fore topgallant sail standing in latter part the same so ends the day much the same

Tuesday April the 1st 1845

First part of this day strong Wind from the N.E. Coars N.W. by W. Capt. employed in turning flag pins Watch employed in ship's duty Middle part the same at 2 PM killed the poor dog towers had been sick for 2 weeks & got up the on the 1st day of April at 2 PM broke latter part the same so ends the day
