

Remarks on Board of the

Saturday April 12

First part of this day strong winds from the E. & S. E. hours 10 to 12 with all possible sail set. Watch employed in ships. Sailing Middle part the same at 3 P.M. saw a sail standing to the N. & W. later part the same so ends the day.

Sunday April the 13th 1845

First part of this day strong winds from the E. & S. E. hours 10 to 12 with all sail set 2 sails in sight. Middle part the same at 10 P.M. looks in. All sailing said & for by galant sail. At 2 P.M. Doubtless landed the force & muzz. Landed later part the same so ends the day.

Monday April the 14th 1845

First part of this day strong winds from the E. & S. E. hours 10 to 12 at 5 P.M. made land of the Labeled. Boat saw 1 day W. West 20 miles at 5 P.M. kept by a land marked at sunset. Landed the force & commenced in getting more several tasks. Middle & latter part the same so ends the day.

Tuesday April 15th 1845

First part of this day light winds from the E. & S. E. still holding up to noon at 8 P.M. someone down & boat & towed the ship. Watch employed in getting the ground tackling in order. Middle part the same at 5 P.M. let go anchor & pulled all the sails so ends the day.

Thursday April the 16th 1845

First part of this day commences filling back for Walter & all other jobs of work. The Banquet Niagara of New Bedford. 250 of oil. Also the crew of New Bedford with 100 oil. Middle part the same & latter part ends the day.

Ship Casander of Providence

Friday April the 17th 1845

this day commences with good weather all hand getting water casks ashore & to fill them. Capt getting vegetables for the ship & the ship's boat is at anchor with 2000 hundred sperm. Middle part same got off a raft of water later part the same so ends the day.

Saturday April the 18th

this day strong downy weather & watch ashore. Capt is getting fruit & provisions. Ship is well & hauled. Breaking out the ship's hair empty basket & Middle part the same. Latter part sent a boat ashore after the liberty men so ends the day much the same.

Sunday April the 19th

this day watch ashore on liberty. Watch aboard employed in strong downy weather & weather. So ends the several ships come in & several going out &.

Monday April the 20th

this day got off a large raft of water & hoisted it in. Watch ashore all day on liberty men employed in strong downy weather so ends the day.

Tuesday April the 21st

this day getting of vegetables for the ship. potatoes & various provisions & 27 ships are lying at anchor several gone out so ends the day much the same.

Wednesday April the 22nd

this day watch ashore & the other employed in ships duty & so ends the day.

Thursday April the 23rd 1845

this day getting off fruit from the ship. Nothing going on watch ashore so ends the day.
