

Remarks On Board of The

Sunday May 25th 1845

First part of this day strong gales from the S.W. heading W.N.W. Dashed all the hatches & gally turned up the Stabbed boat & took all the crew out of the other boats heavy long swell on side & latter part the same so ends the day
Tall 48.10 N. Long

Monday May 26th

First part of this day strong gale of Wind from the S.W. But has lull some times Not quite so long Middle part the same but a S.W. breeze the main topsail set against latter part more moderate so ends the day

Tuesday May 27th

First part of this day strong Wind from the S.W. heading W.N.W. under blast reefed topsails sent the topmast standing sail Booms down heavy squalls of snow & hail at 1 P.M. saw Right Whale & toward Iron 3 boats without success it being so rugged to make much head way at sunset took in sail middle & latter part the same so ends the day of 24 hours Tall 48.45 N. Long

Wednesday May 28th

First part of this day strong gales from the S.W. heading to the W. Hoare ship standing to the S.E. Rainy & foggy heavy squalls long swell middle part the same plenty of snow & hail latter part the same saw Right Whales so ends the day

Thursday May 29th

First part of this day strong Wind from the W.S.W. heading to the N.W. at 8 A.M. saw 2 fin Backs & 1 Right Whale toward 3 boats & stood up in the waist boat but did not catch it him being to far off chased him to Winckles

Thursday May 29th the continuance

from a board 1 boat but did not get out more whales to the leeward went to the West Boats fastened & the Whale sounded & the Stabbed Boats bent on his line the lubber boat forward but the line off in trying to get fast



he took to Windward & did not get along side of him again

Friday May 30th

First part of this day more quiet Wind from the S.W. at 4 P.M. toward the 3 Boats & the Bow Boat struck the West boat bent on his line Whale sounded did not give us chance to get fast No other boats till on middle sunset & the Iron Inboard out spoke the goldenrod of N.B. 2 sails in sight so ends the day

Saturday May 31st 1845

First part of this day strong Wind from the N.W. at 9 A.M. toward 3 boats after Whale the Stabbed Boats started but did not fasten Whale settled down rain & snow Storms 2 sails in sight spoke the Ship Inboard N.B. at 3.30 toward again after night Whales without success middle & latter part the same

Sunday June 1st 1845

First part of this day strong Wind from S.E. all the first part at 5 P.M. raised Right Whale toward 3 boats the Stabbed Boat fastened & the Whale sounded & the line parted at the Whale went off with 1 gun in him some aboard & board again without success middle part variable Wind Double breasted the topsails 2 sails in light foggy & some Rain the falcon also toward with success
