Sunday June 1st the continued

Reaped main topsail here signals of snow & rain
so ends the day much the blowing a gale of wind

Monday June 2nd the
First part of this day blowing a gale of wind from
the S.W. heavy rain fog & hail middle part turned
up the stable boat latter part clear ship
heading S.E. so ends the day of 24 hours

Tuesday June 3rd the D 1845
First part of this day commences strong gales of
wind signals of hail & rain & snow a more on the
sickie list in the cabin middle part the same
& latter part clear ship standing to W
sail in sight so ends the day much the same

Wednesday June 4th the
First part of this day strong winds from the S.W.
heading to S.W. made sail at sun rise to get to
the W. under all Double reefed topsails
sail in sight & a fine back middle part the same
& latter part rainy so ends the day
Lat 50.30.1? Long 178.30

Thursday June 5th the
First part of this day moderate winds from
S.E. lower S.W. W. with the main top galore
sail out saw fine back Rainy & clear ship
at day light middle part the same but 4 P.M.
took in the fore & main topsail & Double reefed the main
blowing strong so ends the day

Friday June 6th the
First part of this day light wind & fog from the S.E.
lower S.W. W. saw fine back Rainy & some hail middle
part the same several sails in the ship took & latter
part clear reefed the fore & main topsail plenty of hump
back in sight so ends the day

Saturday June 7th the
First part of this day strong winds from the S.W.
lower S.W. W. foggy & heavy Watch employed in
Ship's duty middle part the same at sunset
Double reefed the main topsail latter part the same
so ends the day much the same saw fine back

Sunday June 8th the D 1845
First part of this day strong winds from the S.W.
lower W. saw fine back middle part the same
good Whaling Weather at 1 P.M. called all hands to send
down the fore & main topsail & send up some others
latter part light & variable winds so ends the day

Monday June 9th the
First part of this day commences by the variable winds lower
S.W. W. very thick fog & some rain middle part the same
Watch employed in breaking out cod fish & molasses &c.
thick fog saw 2 large Right Whales to thick of fog to cover
took in sail Double reefed topsails so ends the day

Tuesday June 10th the D 1845
First part of this day thick fog & some rain
wind from the S.W. heading to the W.
Watch employed in breaking out the hawl &c.
middle part the same at sunset took in the fore
& main topsail & mainsail latter part the
same so ends the day of 24 hours

Wednesday June 11th the D 1845
First part of this day moderate winds & thick from
the S.W. heading W.V.W. Watch employed in Ship's
duty at 5 P.M. made sail some rain middle part
the same did not take in sail latter part
the same so ends the day
