

Remarks On Board of The Whale

Thursday 12th the

First part of this day Wind from S^W Westward
the fog cleared off 5.30^{am} & 16 saw a right
Whale & lowered 3 boats we could strike the whale
But set in thick fog got him up
at 11 saw another did not lower & sail in
light Middle part Double reefed the topsails
at sunset hoisted up the Boats on the upper 3 courses
at 12 fished the fore mizen top sail. Close reaped the
mizen to the in forward. Latter the same so end the day

Friday June 13th the

First part of this day blowing strong from
the S^W by S fog & rain set day light saw
right Whales to a fog & it blowing hard to
tower saw several through the day at 11 wore
Ship middle part the same Latter part
end the day same

Saturday June 14th D 1845

First part of this day strong winds from
the S^W heading S^W saw a large Whale
thick fog set the fore & mizen
top sail middle part the same
sail in light to the board Latter part
raining with thick fog so end the day

Sunday June 15th D 1845

First part of this day light & variable winds
with thick fog heard several Whales through
the light spotting Watch employed in
Bracking out Water middle part the
same latter part some rain so end the day
fired 2 guns but no answer

Monday June 16th the

First part of this day light & variable winds with
thick fog & some rain through the day middle part
the same at 6 P.M. saw Ship to Windward the
fog cleared off some the ships Boats

fast at sunset and sail on the Caspander
to get to the Windward side & water Watch
latter part the same so end the day

Tuesday June 17th D 1845

First part of this commences with strong winds from
the S^W heading N^W thick fog set in at 1.0
clock A.M. at 10 and sail turned out the reefs
& set the main sail heard the report of a gun
from Ship to Windward raising middle part
& latter part Double reefed the topsails 3 sails
in light so end the day

Wednesday June 18th D 1845

First part of this day light winds & thick
fog at 8 A.M. lowered the Stabbed Boat & went
on Board of the ship Warley of N Bedford
32 months out 16 fished in a Whale close to the
Stabbed Boat where Board raised a right
Whale lowered 3 boats the lubber fastened
the Stabbed then lowered fastened & killed him
& the Whal sunk to the center of gravity & 1/2 m. from
middle part thick fog 3 sails in light
at sunset look in Tail latter part variable winds
so end the day lost 2 shots of line

Thursday June 19th the

First part of this day Wind from the S^W
heading N^W by W at 8 to 10 spoke the
Ship Heeler of Sag Harbor 30 months out Water
2400 lbs of oil at 9 lowered after a sulphur
bottom thought it was a right Whale saw
right Whales to the Windward feet coming on
thick fog 3 sails in light Watch employed in
ships duty middle part the same
latter part variable winds so end the day
saw five backs & sulphur bottoms
